Description of Lodge Programs

Throughout the remainder of this year we will provide service to both our council camp and the community. We also offer the ability to meet OA members from all over the council.

The programs and events that we offer follow the cycle of becoming a member. New members are elected at the unit level by a trained election team and are invited to join the order at an induction weekend. POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Updated 5/3/2015

I. NAME AND AFFILIATION OF THE LODGE

- A. The name of the Lodge is TKäen DōD (Ta-Koon-Dode) 30.
- B. The Lodge shall be affiliated with Five Rivers Council, Boy Scouts Of America, and shall be under the supervision of the Council Camping Committee and the administrative authority of the Scout Executive and the appointed Lodge Advisor serving as his Designee.
- C. The Lodge will establish Chapters, which will follow the boundaries of the current districts of Five Rivers Council.
- D. The totem of this lodge shall be "The Post" aligned with the name meaning "there is a post there" or "land of the post"

II. MEMBERSHIP

- A. The requirements for membership in this Lodge are as stated in the current printing of the Order of the Arrow handbook and require current registration in the Five ivers Council, Boy Scouts of America.
- B. Procedure for the ordeal shall be as stated in the Order of the Arrow handbook and manual for the ordeal.
- C. Elections must be under the supervision of the Lodge Unit Elections committee.
- D. No unit can conduct their own election unless they have the approval or permission of the Chief.
- E. Dues will be \$10.00 if paid by December 31st. After January 1 dues will be \$12.00.
- F. Yearly dues will be payable through December 31st. A mail in "coupon" will be printed in the 3rd and 4th quarter newsletter. A late fee of two additional dollars will be required for all dues paid after December 31st
- G. Inactive member membership lapses when dues are unpaid for a period of 1 year. To be reinstated, a lapsed member must pay a reinstatement of \$5.00 and the current year's dues.

III. OFFICERS

- A. The elected officers of this Lodge shall be: Lodge Chief, Lodge Vice-Chief, Lodge Secretary, and Lodge Treasurer. These elected officers must be under the age of 21 during their entire term.
- B. If Chapters are being utilized a the direction of the Supreme Chief of the Fire the elected officers of each chapter shall be Chapter Chief, up to one Chapter Vice Chief, and up to one Chapter Secretary. These elected officers must be under the age of 21 during their entire term.
- B. The Lodge Executive Committee (Sagamore Council) shall be composed of the elected Lodge officers, Lodge Chief-elect, immediate past Lodge Chief, Lodge Adviser, Chapter Chiefs, and Advisers to each Chapter (where applicable), Scout Executive, and Lodge Staff Adviser.
- C. Prior to being elected all officers will sign a contract(See Appendix) explaining their duties and responsibilities and agreeing to the following remediation plan for a lack of performance: i. Written / Verbal notification of deviation from Lodge Staff Adviser and Lodge Adviser.

- ii. Face to Face meeting with Lodge Adviser and Lodge Staff Adviser to discuss job performance and determine corrective action.
- iii. Mandatory resignation.
- D. Nominations and Elections
 - i. The Chief shall appoint the Nominating Committee in August.
 - ii. The Nominations Committee shall oversee and certify the nomination and election of officers.
 - iii. Nominations may be made from the floor provided the person being nominated is present.
 - iv. A simple majority of votes is necessary to elect an officer. The Chief may vote only in the event of a tie.
 - v. The order of Elections shall be: Chief, Vice Chief, Secretary, and Treasurer
 - vi. There shall be a quorum of the lesser of 25% or 15 of the lodge's registered youth membership to hold an election. After a year and a half since the last election held, the quorum does not apply. The quorum of the lesser of 25% or 15 does not apply for chapters who must have a quorum of 20% of current chapter members.
 - vii. Officers, when elected and through their entire term, must remain active in the Lodge and in the Boy Scouts of America.
 - viii. The Lodge Chief must be a Brotherhood or Vigil member at the time of the election.
 - ix. There shall not be more than two Lodge officers elected from the same unit. More than two are welcome to run for office, but once two have been elected following the order of elections any other members of one unit become ineligible.
 - x. The election shall be held at the Fall Fellowship or at the closest Lodge/Council event thereafter.
 - xi. All rules that apply to lodge elections apply to Chapter elections, unless approved by the Chief or by written agreement at the Sagamore.
- E. Elections will be by secret ballot.
- F. All vacancies or resignations of office, except for Chief, shall be filled by appointment by the Chief with approval from the Lodge Advisor and Staff Advisor (Resignations will be made in writing to the Lodge Executive Committee.)
- G. In the case of resignation of the Chief, the Lodge Vice-Chief will assume position and responsibility. In the case that the Lodge Vice-Chief is unable or unwilling to accept the position and responsibility the position shall be advertised for election at least two weeks prior to the next Lodge Sagamore by popular vote of those attending.
- H. If a lodge member in good standing feels that any Lodge Officer should be deemed unfit to continue to hold their office, that member may make a motion to remove the officer. The Lodge Officer in question must be present and may have 5 minutes to speak before a vote is called and ballots are cast. Any Arrowman present and wishing to speak shall be granted 3 minutes to speak before the vote. A majority, as defined by the current bylaws for making an amendment is required. If the Officer is removed from office, the current rules for succession will apply.

IV. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

A. Chief

- i. Ensures agendas are prepared and presides over all meetings of the Lodge.
- ii. Attends all Section Council of Chiefs Meetings and serves as the designated council youth representative in all Section matters.
- iii. Works with the other Lodge Youth officers and Adult Advisers to plan the program of the Lodge.

- iv. If appointed, serves as the Lodge's youth designee to the Council Executive Board.
- v. Attends all events of the Lodge and serves as the ultimately responsible youth at said events unless properly excused or relieved of his duties by a more appropriate officer.
- vi. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.
- vii. Works with the Lodge Executive Committee to prepare a Lodge Calendar, Lodge Goals, and the current year Journey to Excellence Program.

B Vice-Chief

- i. In the absence of the Lodge Chief, assumes all duties and responsibilities assigned to that position, unless said duty has been specifically delegated to another appropriate officer.
- ii. Serves as the main organizer and overseer of the Unit Election teams and the Unit Election program and coordinates the creation of Election Packets for all units
- iii. Serves as the primary organizer of all OA Troop Representatives in the Lodge.
- iv. Establishes and maintains a positive working relationship with all Council Units through Unit Elections, Camp Promotions, and Troop Representatives.
- v. Works with Chapter Chiefs to ensure success of all Chapter activities and workings within the Chapters.
- vi. Works with the Lodge Chief as the primary developer of Lodge programming.
- vii. Serves as the main authority on Section Conclave Responsibilities in coordination with the Lodge Chief and other officers / chairmen appointed.
- viii. Oversees the development and progress of Special projects to be undertaken by the Lodge and those the Lodge is presently committed to.
- ix. Works to promote all events undertaken by the Lodge in close coordination with the Lodge Secretary.
- x. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Lodge Chief within reason of his office.
- xi. Attends all events and meetings of the Lodge carrying out all duties assigned to him and reporting on his activities.
- xii. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

C. Secretary

- i. Takes the minutes of the Lodge at all meetings. Within fourteen (14) days following a meeting, the minutes will be sent to appropriate members of the Lodge Executive Board.
- ii. Works with the Lodge Chief and Program Vice Chief to produce promotional materials for events as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Lodge Chief, Lodge Adviser, and Lodge Staff Adviser.
- iii. Produces a minimum of four (4) Lodge newsletters a year giving event information, Lodge news, and other requested information for Distribution in February, May, August, and November and sends to the Lodge Webmaster to post on the website
- iv. Maintains an up-to-date roster of Lodge members and adds new members following Ordeals and as new dues paid members are identified.
- v. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Lodge Chief within reason of his office.
- vi. Attends all events and meetings of the Lodge carrying out all duties assigned to him and reporting on his activities.
- vii. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

D. Treasurer

- i. In close coordination with the Lodge Staff Adviser, keeps a close eye on the Lodge's financial situation and reports on the Lodge's finances at all meetings of the Lodge.
- ii. Charts progress of any financial goals set by the lodge for either special projects or general Lodge finance.
- iii. Assumes responsibility for receipting all monies collected at Lodge events and by the Lodge in fundraising efforts.
- iv. Makes recommendations to the Lodge Executive Committee on any decisions involving the use of Lodge finances with regard to financial stability.
- v. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Lodge Chief within reason of his office.
- vi. Attends all events and meetings of the Lodge carrying out all duties assigned to him and reporting on his activities.
- vii. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

E. Webmaster

- i. Appointed by the Chief, the Webmaster takes pictures, text, and information from the Secretary and other committees and posts them in an acceptable format for use by the lodge.
- ii. Within fourteen (14) days following a meeting or event information or pictures should be posted on the website or Facebook page.
- ii. Works with the Lodge Chief and Program Vice Chief to post promotional materials for events as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Lodge Chief, Lodge Adviser, and Lodge Staff Adviser.
- iii. Post the Lodge newsletters to the website and Facebook Page within fourteen days of receipt.
- iv. Maintains an up-to-date list of needs for continued excellence in our digital space.
- v. Oversees content posted on the Lodge's website and Facebook page regularly and contacts his advisor immediately if issues appear.
- vi. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Lodge Chief within reason of his office.
- vii. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

F. Quartermaster

- i. Appointed by the chief, the Quartermaster will be responsible to maintain and keep track of the Ceremonial Costuming and equipment owned by the Lodge.
- ii. Attends all Lodge Executive Committee Meetings and events and serves as the designated youth to check equipment in and out as needed
- iii. Works closely with the Treasurer, Ceremonies, and Activities Chairmen.
- iv. Keep accurate and up to date records to use for restocking supplies, ensuring materials are clean and well kept, and providing for materials needs before events.
- v. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Lodge Chief within reason of his office.
- vi. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

G. Chapter Chief(s)

- i. Ensures agendas are prepared and presides over all meetings of the Chapter.
- ii. Attends all Lodge Executive Committee Meetings and serves as the designated Chapter youth representative in all Lodge matters.
- iii. Works with the other Lodge Youth officers and Adult Advisers to plan the program of the Chapter.

- iv. Attends all events of the Chapter and serves as the ultimately responsible youth at said events unless properly excused or relieved of his duties by a more appropriate officer.
- v. Works with the Lodge Secretary to prepare a Chapter Calendar, Chapter Goals, and Chapter Journey to Excellence Program.
- vi. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

H. Chapter Vice-Chief(Optional)

- i. In the absence of the Chapter Chief, assumes all duties and responsibilities assigned to that position, unless said duty has been specifically delegated to another appropriate officer.
- ii. Serves as the main organizer and overseer of the Unit Election teams and the Unit Election program and coordinates the scheduling for all units for an election.
- iii. Serves as the primary organizer of all OA Troop Representatives in the Chapter in coordination with the Lodge Vice Chief.
- iv. Establishes and maintains a positive working relationship with all District Units through Unit Elections, Camp Promotions, and Troop Representatives.
- vii. Serves as the main promoter of Section Conclave in coordination with the Lodge CVC appointed.
- viii. Oversees the development and progress of Special projects to be undertaken by the Chapter
- ix. Works to promote all events undertaken by the Lodge in close coordination with the Lodge Secretary.
- x. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Chapter Chief within reason of his office.
- xi. Attends all events and meetings of the Chapter carrying out all duties assigned to him and reporting on his activities.
- xii. Serves as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

I. Chapter Secretary (Optional)

- i. Takes the notes and needs of the Chapter at all meetings. Within fourteen (14) days following a meeting, the notes and needs list will be sent to Chapter Leadership including Chapter Advisor and Chapter Staff Advisor.
- ii. Works with the Chapter Chief and Vice Chief to produce promotional materials for events as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Chapter Chief, Chapter Adviser, and Chapter Staff Adviser.
- iii. Provides Chapter content for a minimum of four (4) Lodge newsletters a year giving event information, Chapter news, and other requested information for Distribution in February, May, August, and November.
- iv. Oversees the maintenance of content on the Chapter Information on the Lodge's website.
- v. Performs any duties assigned to him by the Chapter Chief within reason of his office.
- vi. Attends all events and meetings of the Chapter carrying out all duties assigned to him and reporting on his activities.
- as an ideal of the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow and conducts himself in a manner appropriate to his position.

V. COMMITTEES

A. The Lodge Adviser in consultation with the Lodge Staff Adviser appoints committee adult advisors.

- B. Standing committees will include: Camp promotions and unit elections, Finance, Ceremonial and Activities, Communications, Membership, Vigil Honor, Ordeal, and Elangomat.
 - **i.** Ordeal Committee: The Purpose of the Ordeal Committee is to help guide chairman of the Lodge's yearly Ordeals. The Chairman is a youth who has achieved at least the Brotherhood Honor, who is appointed by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Adviser, and Staff Adviser. The Chairman will remain the Chairman until resignation, he reaches the age of 21, or a 2/3 majority vote of the Lodge's Key 3. The Adviser is appointed annually by the Lodge Adviser, in discussion with the Lodge Staff Adviser and Lodge Chief.
 - 1.) Helps select the Chairman for the Lodge's Ordeals
 - 2.) Guides the Ordeal Chairman in running a successful Ordeal
 - **ii. Vigil Honor Committee:** The purpose of the Vigil Honor Committee is to provide for a complete and consistent Vigil Honor induction process from start to finish. The Chairman is a youth vigil honor member who is appointed by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Adviser and Staff Adviser. If there is not a current Youth Vigil Honor member, the Lodge Chief will assume the position until one is available. The chairman will remain the chairman until resignation, he reaches the age of 21, or a 2/3 majority vote of the Lodge's Key 3. The Adviser is appointed annually by the Lodge Adviser in discussion with the Lodge Staff Adviser and Lodge Chief.
 - 1.) Selects the Vigil Honor Nominating Committee, at least 1 youth representative from each chapter, plus any Arrowmen that the Chairman feels is necessary for the nomination process
 - 2.) Reports the results from the annual election process to the Staff Advisor
 - 3.) Performs the Lodge's Vigil Call-Out Ceremony when needed
 - 4.) Performs the Vigil Ceremony when needed
 - 5.) Chairman serves on the Ordeal Committee
 - iii. Elangomat Committee: The purpose of the Elangomat Committee is to provide a memorable induction process by creating and maintaining a team of trained Elangomats to be utilized during the induction process. The Chairman is a youth who has achieved at least the Brotherhood Honor who is appointed by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Lodge Adviser and Staff Adviser. The chairman will remain the chairman until resignation, he reaches the age of 21, or a 2/3 majority vote of the Lodge's Key 3. The Adviser is appointed annually by the Lodge Adviser in discussion with the Lodge Staff Adviser and Lodge Chief.
 - 1.) Creates and maintains a directory of willing and trained Elangomats to be utilized during the Ordeal Process
 - 2.) Creates and maintains Elangomat incentives
 - 3.) Holds at least 1 yearly training session for new Elangomats, as well as for any Arrowman who is interested
 - 4.) Coordinates Nimats for the Brotherhood Walks
- C. Adhoc Committees will include: Nominations Committee, Conclave, National Order of the Arrow Committee, Founders Award, and Annual Banquet.
- D. Lodge Officers will make a report of what their respective committees have done since the last Sagamore.
- E. Other committees may be formed as needed by the Lodge Chief with the approval of the Lodge Advisor, Staff Advisor and a majority vote of those in attendance at the Sagamore.
- F. Every active member of the Lodge should belong to at least one committee. All participants at Lodge ordeals should sign up for at least one committee and should be informed of what is in the by-laws of the Lodge and what the committee's functions are.

- A. The Lodge meetings shall be held at least one per month from August through June.
- B. Chapter meetings will be held at least six times a year.
- C. The Lodge shall publish a yearly plan book which must include a contract made out from the officers with their plan for the year which was approved by the Sagamore Council. This contract lists all of the year's activities and goals.

VII. AMENDMENTS

A. Amendments to the rules of the Lodge Policies and Procedures must be submitted in writing, and approved by the Sagamore Council at least 30 days prior to going before the entire Lodge. Any changes should be provided in a format that can easily show the original wording and the new by highlighting or bolding new passages and striking through proposed deletions. To be ratified an amendment must pass by a 2/3 vote of the youth active members.

Order of the Arrow Troop Representative

Job Description, Duties, Qualifications, and Script for after Elections

OA Troop Representative Job Description:

An Order of the Arrow Troop Representative is a youth liaison serving between the local OA lodge or chapter and his or her troop. In his or her troop, he or she serves as a communication and programmatic link to the Arrowman and adult leaders and Scouts who are not presently members of the Order. He or she does this in a fashion that strengthens the mission of the lodge and purpose of the Order. By setting a good example, he or she enhances the image of the Order as a service arm to his or her troop.

OA Troop Representative Duties:

- · Serves as a communication link between the lodge or chapter and the troop.
- · Encourages year round and resident camping in the troop.
- · Encourages older Scout participation in high adventure programs.
- · Encourages Scouts to actively participate in community service projects.
- · Assists with leadership skills training in the troop.
- · Encourages Arrowmen to assume leadership positions in the troop.
 - · Encourages Arrowmen in the troop to be active participants in the lodge and/or chapter activities and to seal their membership in the Order by becoming Brotherhood members.
- · Sets a good example
- · Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly.
- · Lives by the Scout Oath, Scout Law and OA Obligation
- · Shows Scout spirit

OA Troop Representative Qualifications:

- · Under 21 years old
- · Appointed by SPL with SM approval
- · OA Member in good standing

OA Troop Representative Reports To:

Assistant Senior Patrol Leader Scout Master

Troop Representative discussion with Candidates after an Election

"I congratulate you on your selection to the Order of the Arrow! However, you are not yet members. Ahead of you lies an experience that we call the Ordeal. You have directions on when and where you may begin your induction. Do you have any questions now?"

(Answer any questions briefly and honestly. If a question is answered by the information in the envelope, say "That's an excellent question, you will find the answer in your envelope." If a candidate appears to have a special need, then arrange to discuss it privately later.)

"When you return to your troop, your friends may ask you questions about what we discussed. The best response is to smile and change the subject. If you maintain the mystery of what happened here, you will make them curious, and perhaps, inspire them to behave in a way that leads to their election! Let's all quietly return, making as little disturbance as possible."

TKäen DōD LODGE CEREMONY POLICY

It is the intention of the Lodge to present impressive ceremonies that follow National guidelines while maintaining health and safety as a priority. We must keep on our mind that the members, for which the ceremony is present, are being honored through our ceremonies and our actions in every way should exemplify this.

Please read this document in its entirety to ensure a full understanding of these policies. The policies are in place to ensure health, safety, youth protection and legal issues or problems do not arise. Violations of these policies will result in immediate dismissal from a ceremony team and the potential of having your membership with the Lodge and the Council revoked. I urge you to take these policies seriously and ensure your ceremony team is in compliance.

- · No hazing or initiations of any variety are allowed at any Lodge or B.S.A. sponsored event.
- All ceremony teams must follow the official OA ceremony book as printed by National. No modifications are allowed.
- Use your common sense. Most everyone knows when hazing is going on. If it is occurring, you should make every effort to stop it immediately.
- · Ceremony team members and assistants must wear footwear during ceremonies. This is a safety matter for the ceremony team and only makes sense for all participants.
- · Ceremony team members must have underwear on underneath breach cloths and similar regalia. This is a youth protection issue and will avoid any embarrassment for team members and candidates.
- The ceremony team must not put the candidate in harm's way during the ceremony. This includes making sure trails are cleared and fires are kept to a reasonable size.
- · When the candidates sleep under the stars, they must remain on Camp property and adult advisers must know their location in case of emergency.
- · Water must be made available to candidates at all times.
- · During the call-out, there is to be no "pulling" of a candidate. The ceremony team should merely act as guides to bring the candidate in front of the chief.
- · During the call-out, the tapping of the shoulder should only be a slight touch. As a guide, the Chief should hear no sound from the tap. If the team cannot determine how light should be, simply stop the downward movement prior to touching the candidate. This is a youth protection issue and this must be followed.
- · Use your common sense. If something seems unsafe or you have a feeling that something should not be done, do not do it. It may anger people at the event, however, cooler heads will prevail.

Sash Etiquette

- The OA sash may only be worn by registered members of the BSA who are currently registered members of the Order of the Arrow.
- The OA sash my only be worn with the Official BSA uniform or Scouting's official adult dress wear for adults, by Elangomats who are not in uniform, by youth wearing ceremonial attire, and in such other instances as may be approved by the Scout Executive.
- The OA sash may only be worn over the right shoulder so that the arrow is pointing over the right shoulder and the sash is diagonal across the chest. It <u>may not</u> be worn in any other manner. It should never be folded and hang from your belt.
- The OA sash may not be altered in any way or form. Beading or other material is not permitted on the sash. Nothing may be worn on the sash including, signatures, patches of any kind, pins or legends. Either of these awards may be worn as an option, by those who may have earned them. They are worn above the bar at the point of the arrow.
- The OA Sash must be worn only at Order of the Arrow or approved functions.

OA History

The Order of the Arrow (OA) was founded by Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson in 1915 at the Treasure Island Camp of the Philadelphia Council, Boy Scouts of America. It became an official program experiment in 1922 and was approved as part of the Scouting program in 1934. In 1948 the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the national camping program of the Boy Scouts of America.



Lodge History



On January 1, 1990, the Seneca Lodge of Sullivan Trail Council in Elmira merged with the Wakanda Lodge of Steuben Area Council in Bath NY. As was the practice at that time, new lodges created by council mergers took the lower lodge number. This happened to be #186, which represented the Wakanda Lodge (later in 1992 when the General Sullivan Council was annexed TKaen DoD #186 took the lower Winnigus Lodge #30). The winter fellowship at Camp Gorton in February 1990 saw Arrowmen from both Wakanda and Seneca Lodges come together to design a

new flap and to pick a lodge name. Ken Masteller was adviser of Wakanda at the time of the merger and Mike McCarthy of Elmira was the lodge adviser of Seneca Lodge. The new lodge also had co-chiefs, Brian Eno from Seneca Lodge and Mark Kosty from Wakanda. The merger was a very harmonious merger since most of the lodge officers had participated in a two council contingent troop at the 1989 jamboree. The merger was so positive that the chiefs were asked to lead a session at the 1990 NOAC, held at Indiana University, on how to promote the true spirit of brotherhood when lodges are forced to merge due to council mergers.

The council name of Five Rivers had already been selected from a council wide contest held during 1989. At the winter fellowship the Arrowmen wanted to have a lodge name that complimented the council name. Since the "five rivers" merged in Painted Post and since "Painted Post's" origin was Senecan (Chief Montour stands in the center of the village), the Arrowmen wanted to find out the Seneca name for "Painted Post." Chiefs Eno and Kosty traveled to the Seneca reservation near Syracuse to talk to Myrtle Peterson. Mrs. Peterson was the instructor on the reservation of the Senecan language. When the chiefs met with Mrs. Peterson she told them that the Senecas never had a painted post. The post that existed in the Painted Post area was not "painted". This plain post had been used as a type of bulletin board and when the white settlers moved into the area they painted it. To paint this post was desecration to the Seneca people. Mrs. Peterson suggested to our chiefs that they name the lodge TKäen DoD meaning "Land of the post". By doing this they would honor the Seneca people, compliment the council's Five Rivers name and be a name that the idea and research had originated with the youth of the lodge. TKäen DoD was thus born and has been our lodge name since the spring of 1990.

The Founders Award

Introduced at the 1981 National Order of the Arrow Conference, the Founder's Award recognizes Arrowmen who have given outstanding service to their lodge. The award is reserved for an Arrowman who demonstrates that he or she personifies the spirit of selfless service, as advocated by founder E. Urner Goodman and cofounder Carroll A. Edson. The award is a handsome bronze medallion bearing the likenesses of E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson, with a wooden base and a brass



plate suitable for engraving. Available for uniform wear is a gold-colored arrow suspended from a red ribbon.


